Year 7 Selective High School 2021 - Important information:

Intention to apply for Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2021. Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday, 12th March 2020. If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). The application website **opens at that link on 8 October 2019** and **closes on 11 November 2019**. You must apply before the closing date. There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 8 October 2019. You must submit only **ONE** application for each student.

PBL Wellbing Tip for Parents - What's the best drink to quench a thirst? Water!

Even better, it has none of the sugar, found in fruit drinks, soft drinks, sports drinks and flavoured mineral waters, which can cause tooth decay. Fruit juice, which contains Vitamin C, is often seen as a healthy choice of drink. However, fruit juice is high in sugar and kilojoules, just like fruit drinks, flavoured mineral water, energy drinks and soft drinks. For example, a 250ml cup of apple juice or cola contains up to six teaspoons of sugar. Add it up: just one can of soft drink per day adds 18 kilos of sugar to our diet! You can have them occasionally, but these drinks are not a necessary part of a healthy diet.

How much to drink?

The recommended daily amount of fluids is:

- 5 glasses (1 litre) for 5 to 8 year olds
- 7 glasses (1.5 litres) for 9 to12 year olds
- 8 to 10 glasses (2 litres) for 13+ years

You should drink more water when you're exercising or on a hot day. We often don't feel thirsty even when our bodies need fluid, so it's a good idea to drink water regularly throughout the day.

Pack your child a healthy lunch box!

Did you know children consume around 30% of their daily food intake at school? Most of this comes from the contents of their lunchbox. Healthy lunches and snacks help children concentrate, learn and play throughout the day. We know that children need to eat plenty of fruit and vegetables every day, as well as wholegrains, milk products (including cheese and yoghurt), meat and meat alternatives and water. You can include all of this in your child's lunch box and still make it fun and interesting to eat. By planning ahead, you can make sure that your child's lunch box has each of the five key food groups. Always remember to pack a water bottle!
