#### **Appin Massacre Memorial and Flag Raising Ceremony**

April is a time for remembering, healing, and reconciliation. Winga Myamly Reconciliation Group, the Aboriginal community and supporting service providers invite all interested residents to attend the Appin Massacre Memorial Service. Ms Paxton will be the supervising teacher on the day. The ceremony is to remember the Dharawal people who perished in the massacre in 1816. **The ceremony is being held at Cataract Dam Picnic Area, Baden Powell Drive, Appin on Sunday, 14 April 2024 from 11:00am to 3:30pm.** Participants are advised to bring appropriate footwear, hats, sunscreen and bottled water. Fold up chairs are also recommended as seating is limited. Food variety is limited so those with special dietary requirements are advised to bring something of their own. There is accessible parking and a short walk to the memorial site. There will be a bus service for those unable to walk the short distance to the site. Campbelltown City Council will also hold a Memorial Flag Raising Ceremony in the forecourt of the Council building. This ceremony will take place on **Wednesday, 17 April 2024 from 10:00am to 11:00am**.



#### **Download School Bytes Parent App**

Appin Public School uses the School Bytes Parent App. All parents are requested to download the School Bytes Parent App to make and view payments and receipts, and to complete and return permission notes. The App makes it easier to use School Bytes for your mobile devices. School Bytes provides a parent portal to help your school communicate with you. Our school uses the parent portal for various things, including online permission notes, attendance, and payments, which can be accessed via a secure link. The School Bytes parent portal enables you to view all your children in one portal and process payments for multiple siblings in one transaction. All fees can be paid off in instalments, by adjusting the amount you wish to pay at the time. Please assist us by downloading the App and using this system to make payments and return notes.

#### Staff Car Park Reminder

As most parents are aware, our school has a dedicated gate and path for families entering and exiting OOSH in our school hall, before and after school or in the holidays for Vacation Care. This alleviates the need for any parent or child to use our school car park thus ensuring the safety of all families. This safety initiative and improvement has come directly from the Department of Education as a direct result of the terrible tragic accident 6 years ago in a Western Sydney school car park, when a car driven by a parent, injured students and a student lost their life. We understand that some parents using OOSH find this frustrating, however, it is to maximise the safety of everyone's children. It is suggested that parents park on Appin Road then enter and exit OOSH via the OOSH gate and path. Parents are asked not to walk through our staff car park in the afternoons but enter and exit from our front pedestrian gate. There is no staff car park access at any time. We thank you for your support.

#### Attendance


