## 2025

We look forward to seeing **Kindergarten through to Year 6** back at school on **Thursday, 6 February, 2025.** While our Year 3 to Year 6 is at the Swimming Carnival, **Year 1 and Year 2 students** will place their bags outside their 2024 classrooms when they arrive at school and line up outside their 2024 classroom when the 9:00am bell rings.

## Body and Mind Wellbeing Program 2025

**Each Tuesday of Term 1,** students in Years K-6 will participate in a Body and Mind Wellbeing Program at Appin Public School. The program will run for eight, 40 minute sessions each **Tuesday from 18 February to 8 April 2025**. The purpose of the program is to have students become more aware of their emotional responses to every day problems, the impact it has on their bodies and concentration and the tools to better self regulate in school. The program explores social health, mental health, emotional health and physical health. It is delivered with the use of wireless headphones. Students will be supplied with headphones and a yoga mat to use at each session. No permission note is required and the cost of this program will be covered by school funds.



## **Download School Bytes Parent App**

Appin Public School uses the School Bytes Parent App. All parents are requested to download the School Bytes Parent App to make and view payments and receipts, and to complete and return permission **notes.** The App makes it easier to use School Bytes for your mobile devices. School Bytes provides a parent portal to help your school communicate with you. Our school uses the parent portal for various things, including online permission notes, attendance, and payments, which can be accessed via a secure link. The School Bytes parent portal enables you to view all your children in one portal and process payments for multiple siblings in one transaction. All fees can be paid off in instalments, by adjusting the amount you wish to pay at the time. Please assist us by downloading the App and using this system to make payments and return notes.

## **Huskisson Class**

Huskisson has had a fantastic finish to 2024!

We had a blast on our excursion, learning how to solve challenges as part of a team and climbing the giant rock wall.

This term, Huskisson students have learned how to balance equivalent number sentences. Using their knowledge of addition, subtraction, and multiplication, they worked out the missing numbers to balance their equations.

In Technology, we've been learning how to block code using Microbits and Spheros. Students had the opportunity to code and create exciting projects, such as light sensors, music players, and LED signals. They also designed tracks and coded their Spheros to follow their creations.



















## **Kiandra Class**

Although we are quickly approaching the end of the school year, Kiandra students have continued to work hard! We have been revising maths concepts such as time, measurement, multiplication, addition and subtraction. Each day we have been revising these concepts through fun, hands-on games and activities. Last week, we joined classes with Huskisson for two lessons and learnt some simple ways to code using a micro: bit and computer. The micro: bit can be used to create games, step counters, disco lights, and more. It's designed for children aged 8 and up, but anyone can use it to code!

Kiandra students also loved going to Wedderburn Campsite for their recent Stage 2 excursion. It was fantastic to see them cheering each other up the rock-climbing wall and working together during initiative games. I was very proud of the resilience and teamwork they showed on this day.
