Swimming Carnival 2025 - NB: FIRST DAY BACK FOR 2025

The Swimming Carnival for 2025 will be held on **Thursday, 6 February 2025**. Students will travel to the pool via seat belted bus. **Departing school at 8:15am and returning by 3pm.** Students in Years 3 to 6 (in 2025) are expected to attend. Year 2 (2025) students who turn 8 in 2025, who are competitive swimmers may also attend. **Year 2 (2025) parents please contact the school office for a permission note to be emailed to you if required.** Our 2025 swimming carnival is the **first day back at school**, so arrangements must be finalised before the end of this year. **The cost of this event has been reduced to \$4.00, due to the generosity of our P&C who will cover the cost of transport to and from the pool.**

IMPORTANT: NO MONEY is required this year. You will be invoiced in Term 1 2025 for this fee. The school will provide coloured wrist bands to identify weak swimmers as an added safety precaution. Please record this information on the permission note, by ticking WEAK SWIMMER. Please accept this permission note online by 9:30am, Monday 16 December even if your child is not attending the carnival. Students who do not have permission notes returned by 9.30am Monday 16th December WILL NOT be allowed to attend the carnival. (This is for organisation and risk assessment purposes.) Thank you for your support in this matter.

2025 Kindergarten Enrolments

Applications are now due for Kindergarten 2025. If your child turns 5 before July 31, 2025 they are eligible to start school next year. The School Bytes parent portal enables you to view all your children in one portal and process payments for multiple siblings in one transaction. 
To congratulate/thank students who are Ministers or received their Gold Award & Aussie of the Month, a special morning tea will take place after eating time.

Dampier Peninsula

Location

200km (124 miles) north of Broome, the Dampier Peninsula is a significant regional centre in Western Australia. It's bordered by the Indian Ocean surrounding a lot of Australia, to the west and the waters of King Sound to the east. The beautiful peninsula is known for its pristine and remote landscapes, giving a sense of isolation and natures beauty.

Indigenous heritage

The Bardi and Nyul Nyul people have been the traditional custodians of the land of Dampier Peninsula for tens of thousands of years, with strong ties to the land and sea. Traditional practices include fishing, hunting and gathering, that are still integral to their cultural identity.

Tourism

The Dampier Peninsula attracts tourists from all over for activities like whale watching, it becomes most popular while migration season when humpback whales pass through the region. Eco tourism initiatives promote sustainable travel allowing visitors to experience the beauties of the natural environment while supporting the local communities.
